## Center for Accommodative Services (CAS)

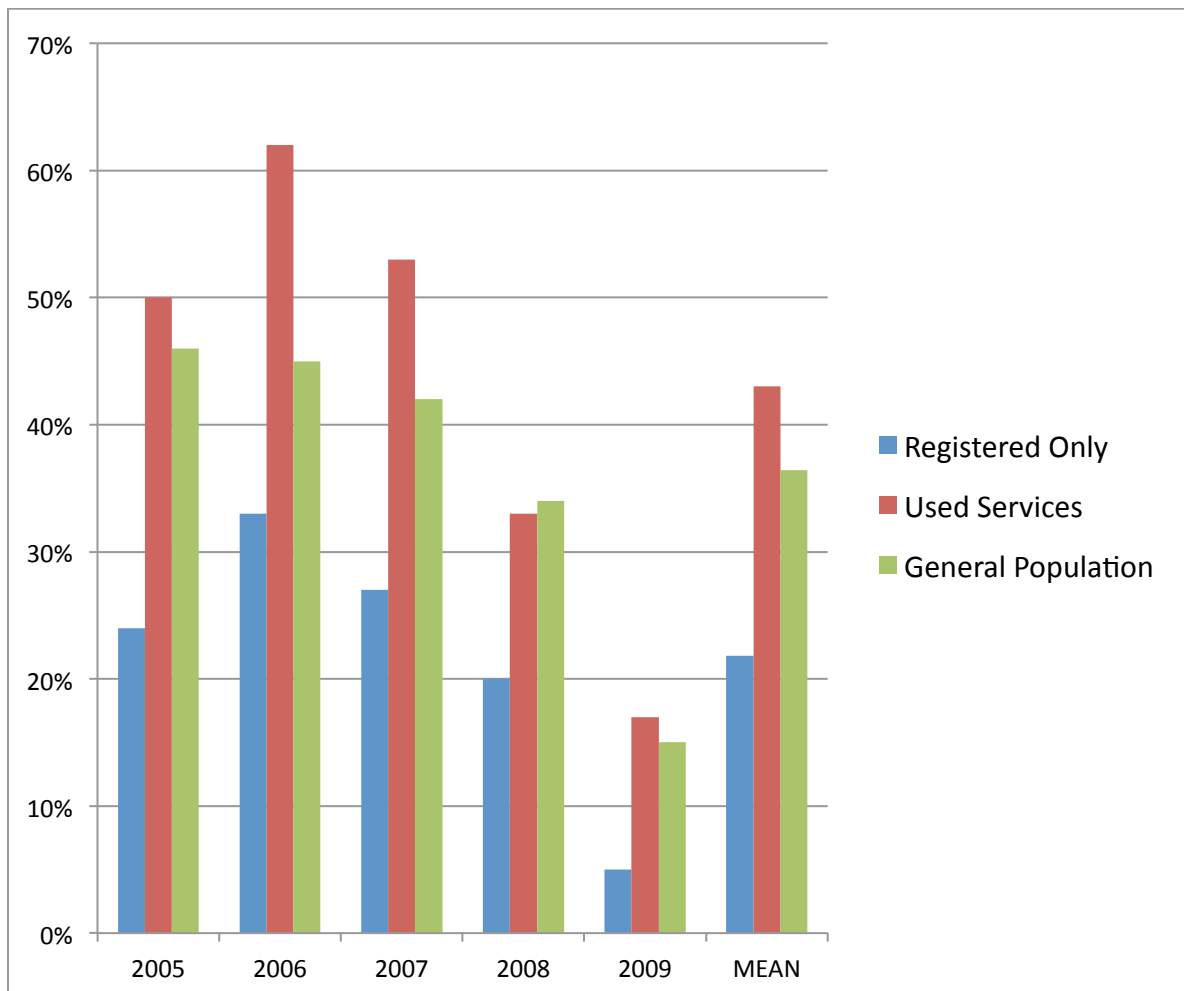
### First Time Students Seeking Associates or Bachelor's Degrees

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Students with disabilities who use accommodations graduate, on average, at a rate higher than those with disabilities who do not use accommodations -- and the general population!

The red bar on the graph below represents the graduation rate of students who use accommodations as compared to their peers.

Among the factors that may account for lower graduation rates for students with LD are:

- Oral and written language deficits
- Executive functioning problems
- Difficulty disclosing LD
- Asking for appropriate support
